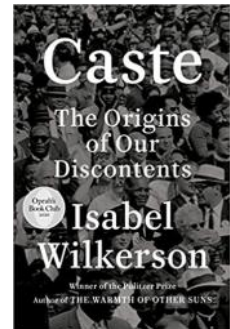

Travels and Wildlife Research in the Chernobyl Exclusion Zone (CEZ) –

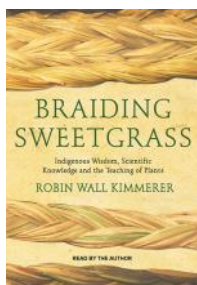

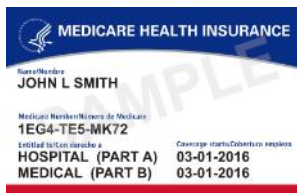
